Directives for the Management of Computer Laboratories

October 19, 2011 Passed by the Administrative Meeting of the Computer and Information
Networking Center

- Article 1 The National Taiwan University (NTU or “the University”) Computer and Information Networking Center (“the Center”) formulates the *Directives for the Management of Computer Laboratories* (“the Directives”) to ensure current NTU students’ right to use the University’s computer laboratories for their learning and research needs and to maintain the quality of service at the laboratories.
- Article 2 Use of the computer laboratories shall comply with the University’s *Campus Network Usage Regulations*, the Ministry of Education’s *Taiwan Academic Network Management and Norms*, and other laws and regulations of Taiwan.
- Article 3 Users who are found to have committed any of the following violations shall be barred from using the Center’s computer laboratories for one month:
1. Bringing food and beverages into a computer laboratory
 2. Sleeping, playing computer games, or otherwise occupying a seat without using the computer
 3. Making noise
 4. Littering
 5. Occupying two or more computers at the same time
 6. Lending NTU accounts to others, or borrowing or hacking into others’ NTU accounts
 7. Accessing, using, or copying illegal software
 8. Accessing, using, or copying copyright-protected materials and files
 9. Engaging in acts of vandalization, hacking, or theft
 10. Unauthorized destruction, moving, modification, or disassembly of computer hardware and equipment, including keyboards, mice, CPUs, and monitors
 11. Unauthorized use of or connection to ethernet or power cables
 12. Connecting a personal computer to the network or a power outlet in a laboratory
 13. Browsing pornographic websites
 14. Engaging in activities unrelated to education or research
- Article 4 The Regulations shall be passed by the Center’s Administrative Meeting and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
